Attempting to Create a Ripple

As the new year has come, I have been reflecting on my life and what I have done with it thus far. I want my life in Christ to make a difference whether small or great somewhere in this moment of time that I have been given. I have reflected on my past, and I see the difference that Jesus the Christ has made in my present, and I have hope for the future. The preacher offers us some timely counsel in Ecclesiastes 7:8-10 that will help us rightly measure our time and set godly goals for this new year.

Learn from the past (v. 8a) "Better is the end of a thing than its beginning" When the end is reached, the whole picture comes into view, and that is what matters most. We make mistakes, we experience victories, we often focus on temporary matters. Is what I have been spending my life doing of any eternal value? What I have done, not what I thought about doing, is all that will matter in eternity. "Those who fail to learn their history are doomed to repeat it." We must learn from past successes and failures of ourselves and others. "If you don't have time to do something right the first time, when will you have the time to do it over?"

Live in the present (8b-9) "And the patient in spirit is better than the proud in spirit. Be not quick in your spirit to become angry, for anger lodges in the heart of fools." Living in the present involves replacing our pride with patience. Pride, impatience, and haughtiness push wisdom aside and lead to harboring anger and resentment. In all cases it is better to wait for God's timing. We must learn to trust God now, do our best now, learn from the past and use wisdom now. Sometimes we become so consumed with where we have been, and with where we want to go, that we forget where we are at. In order to use a road map, you must first locate where you are at.

Look to the future (10) "Say not, 'Why were the former days better than these?' For it is not from wisdom that you ask this." Pride and bitterness encourage wasteful and foolish longings for yesterday. We cannot return to the past, but we can use the lessons of the past to make better decisions in the present because each helps us to determine our future. We need to appreciate all of our life, and its opportunities. If we fail to learn from our past, if we fail to apply life's lessons to our present, we will not have much of a future to look forward to.

Someone once stated, "Only one life, twill soon be past. Only what's done for Christ will last."

Lake Sallateeska: IBSA offers free retreat time for pastors and their wives. The directors of the camps are available for prayer and directed retreats. When getting away for a few days isn't enough, ministers and spouses can take advantage of counseling opportunities offered by Pathways Counseling, a service of the Baptist Children's Home and Family Services.
